Dr. Melanie Ni Dhuinn, Trinity College, Dublin and Teaching Council of Ireland member (Post Primary ITE HEI nominee)

Dr. Melanie Ní Dhuinn is Assistant Professor of Teacher Education and School Placement Coordinator in the School of Education, Trinity College, Dublin. Melanie works across Teacher Education (B.Mus Ed and PME), Master of Education (M.Ed) and Doctorate (D.Ed and PhD) courses in the School of Education and is a research supervisor and examiner for PME, M.Ed, Ph. D and D.Ed candidates. Melanie lectures in Teaching Pedagogies, School Placement, Research Methods and in the Sociology of Education.



Prof. Charles Hopkins, York University, Toronto

Charles Hopkins holds the UNESCO Chair in Reorienting Education towards Sustainability at York University in Toronto, Canada. He has numerous publications and has lectured worldwide on a range of topics from quality education to educating for global citizenship and educating for a sustainable future. Professor Hopkins is advisor to the United Nations University's Global Network of Regional Centres of Expertise on ESD and Co-Director of the Asia-Pacific Institute on Education for Sustainable Development in Beijing, China.



Dr. Massimiliano Tarozzi, University of Bologna

Dr. Tarozzi is a full professor in Education at the Department of Life Quality Studies, where he teaches in the areas of General Education and Global Citizenship Education, and where he chairs the International Research Centre on Global Citizenship Education. He is co-director of the Development Education Research Centre at the Institute of Education, University College London, and co-ordinator of the Angel Network (Academic Network on Global Education & Learning).
